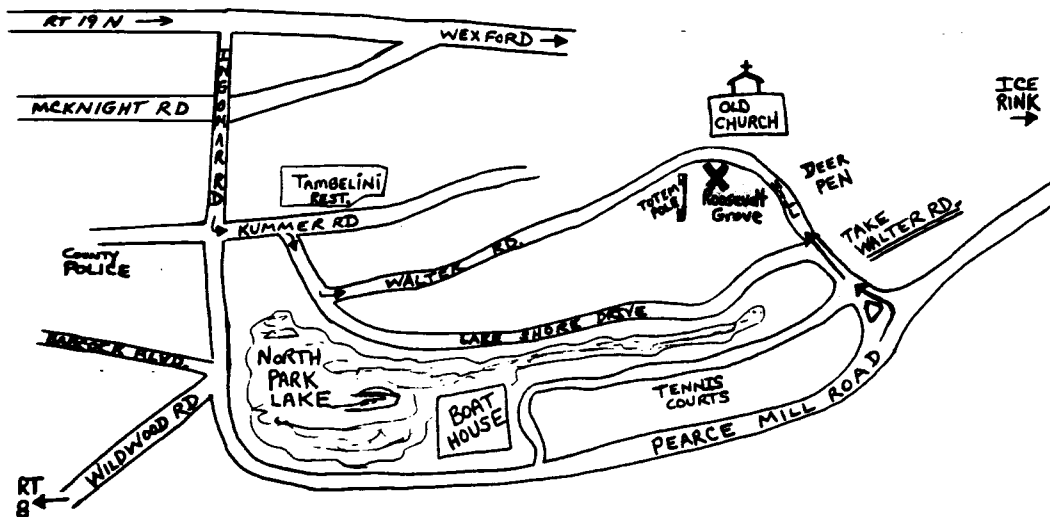
TECH TIPS

(From Bob Macabobby, NE Ohio Mustang Club)

REMOVING BUMPER STICKERS: To remove old bumper stickers & dried-up tape, try using 3M's General Purpose Adhesive Cleaner. Lift an edge of the sticker with a knife or razor blade, soak the sticker with this cleaner, let it soak and the sticker is history

POLISHING/REMOVING SCRATCHES FROM GUAGE LENS: Try polishing the lens with Semichrome Polish. It works best if you take the instrument cluster apart and polish both sides.

POLISHING/REMOVING SCRATCHES FROM WINDOW GLASS: Professional glass shops use Cerium Oxide. Apply this with a damp rag or buffing cloth. This forms a mild "rubbing compound" that is abrasive enough to remove small scratches by hand, or bigger ones by using a buffing pad.

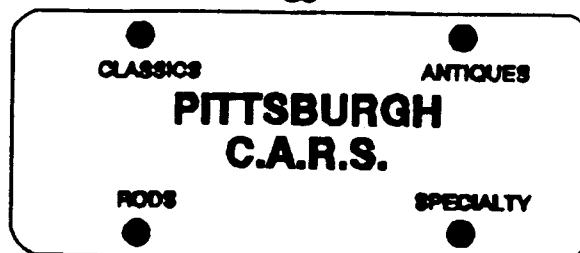

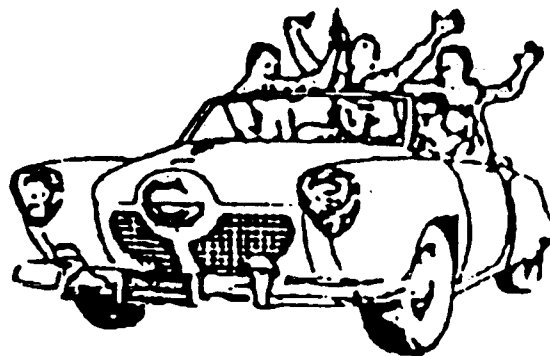
