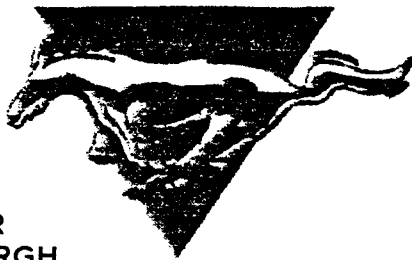



## **Legislative Update**

I've been waiting for this one. Six years ago, when my Mustang was ready to roll, I applied for a classic plate. I was flatly refused on the grounds that Ford still made the Mustang. It seemed to me that the state had no clue as to what constitutes a "classic," and that the classic plate program was not being administered as intended. (Of course, in the strictest of terms, a "classic" is a car recognized by the Classic Car Club of America, which means that few if any of the cars currently wearing classic plates are actually classics.)

Senate Bill 578 intends to correct this situation. Cars which are maintained in or restored to a condition which is very close to its original specifications and are at least fifteen years old are eligible for classic plates. A car no longer needs to be out of production to qualify for a classic plate, but pictures are still required to ensure that vehicles are in a suitable condition.

Additionally, the bill provides a definition for a "collectible motor vehicle." This would provide for a modified vehicle maintained in collectible condition to be eligible for a Collectible Registration Plate. The conditions and restrictions for this class of plate are the same as for antique and classic plates.

Also part of Senate Bill 578 is the death of the Cash for Clunkers program. In its place is a "Cash for Repairs" program, which provides credit for repairing, rather than destroying, polluting vehicles. Once polluting vehicles are repaired and re-certified, a pollution credit is issued in accordance with the Federal Clean Air Act Amendments.

Senate Bill was co-authored by TRCCC Technical Resource Consultant Joe Popovich and signed into law by Governor Ridge on December 20, 1995.

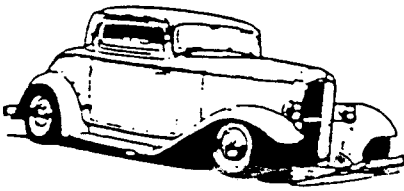

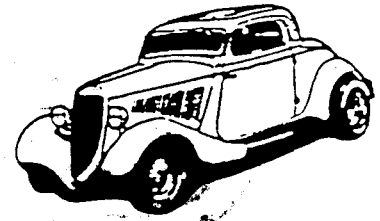

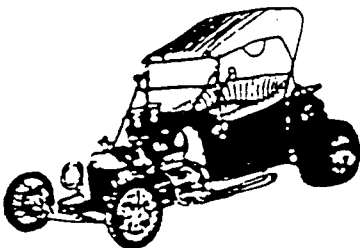
